Introduction of under-graduate courses in IIMs

1139 Shri Kartikeya Sharma:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs) have started under-graduate courses as well, if so details of the IIMs which have launched this course, number of seats and fee structure;
- (b) what is the mode of selection of students, criteria, cutoff, exam pattern and number of applicants for the exam this year; and
- (c) whether Government has given any guidance to other IIMs as well for starting UG courses in line with recommendations from the NEP, if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (DR. SUKANTA MAJUMDAR)

(a) to (c): At present, seven (07) IIMs offer the Integrated Programme in Management (IPM), a five-year dual-degree programme. These are: IIM Indore, IIM Ranchi, IIM Amritsar, IIM Bodh Gaya, IIM Jammu, IIM Rohtak and IIM Shillong. IIM Shillong and IIM Amritsar is starting its first Batch of IPM in 2025. Students may exit the IPM course after three (03) years which leads to the award of an undergraduate degree. Number of seats in IPM varies from 60 to 180 across these Seven (07) IIMs.

Further, four (04) IIMs namely IIM Bangalore, IIM Kozhikode, IIM Sambalpur and IIM Sirmaur have started under-graduate programmes. Details of IPM and other under-graduate programmes including number of seats and fee structure may be seen at https://www.education.gov.in/en/parl_ques.

The IIM Act, 2017, inter alia, empowers each IIM to specify and conduct courses of study, training and research in management and allied subjects. It further empowers the Board of Governors of each IIM to establish departments, faculties or schools of studies and initiate programmes or courses of study at the institute.
